Instructions

- Forms are distributed to districts, charter schools, and private schools upon request by contacting the Utah State Board of Education (USBE), Adult Education, merick.masters@schools.utah.gov; 801-538-7509.
- The form is required for students ages 16-18 whose class has not graduated who are considering entering an adult education program or taking the GED® Test.
- > Students must meet with a school official (usually a school counselor) to obtain the form.
- The completed form should be submitted to a state-sponsored adult education program to enroll in adult education and/or to remove the alerts on the GED account. The Utah Adult Education Program Directory can be found at schools.utah.gov/adulteducation.
- > The form assures that
 - The student and parent have been counseled about their educational options and the potential consequences associated with their educational decisions;
 - A student enrolling in adult education or taking the GED® Test is formally withdrawn from the public K-12 education system; and
 - Parental permission has been given to take the GED® test or enroll in adult education.

Section 1 – Completed for all students

- The student must sign Section 1 while meeting with the school official.
- ➤ The school official will fill out the section that says, "To be completed by school personnel."
- The school counselor will sign the form indicating counseling has been provided to the student on the potential educational consequences of this decision, including that students who pass the GED® exam cannot return to a K-12 school for any reason.
 - Note: This does not pertain to students who have a current special education IEP as a GED® does not end the student's access to a free and appropriate public education (FAPE) under IDEA.
- > The principal or designee will sign the form to verify the student has completed the LEA's K-12 withdrawal process. School officials can sign the form for students living within their boundaries that aren't currently enrolled in any Utah K-12 school or LEA as verified through the SSID system.

Section 2 - Completed for students enrolling in adult education

- The student will sign Section 2 indicating they understand and accept the consequences of this enrolling in adult education.
- ➤ The parent/guardian will sign Section 2 indicating they understand and accept the consequences of this decision and grant permission for the student to be enrolled in adult education.
 - Note: A parent/guardian signature is not required for students who are married or emancipated.

Section 3 – Completed for students taking the GED

- > The student will need to create an account on GED.com first.
- > The student and parent/guardian must sign in Section 3 if the student is intending to take the GED® Test.

Section 3 – Completed for students taking the GED

➤ If the student is 16 and desires to take the GED®, the student must provide proof of academic readiness to a state-sponsored adult education program. Adult education programs can administer an academic assessment to validate that the candidate is academically ready to take the GED® Test if the student does not provide proof. Enrolling in adult education and completing a GED preparation course also fulfills the requirement to show academic readiness.
